- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11

- Large 7" Diameter Satiny Pink Blooms with Rose Halo on 25"-34" Scapes
- Sculptural Dark Blue-Green 18"-24" Tall Evergreen Foliage
- Blooms 40-150 Days Per Year, Depending on Climate
- Tall Bloom Presentation and Unique Color are Dramatic as an Accent, Stunning in a Mass
- Graceful Scapes Sway in Most Breezes
- Recommended for USDA Zones 5-11
- Moderate Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Exhibition Category



Chorus Line (2004)

- Beautifully Formed 3"-4" Diameter Light Pink Blooms on 20"-25" Tall Scapes, Slight Fragrance
- Medium Green 15"-20" Tall Semi-Evergreen Foliage, Tolerates Some Shade
- Blooms 50-120 Days Per Year
- Nice Border Plant and Works Well in Patio Containers
- Moderate Rust Resistance
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Winner in the Exhibition Category



Bitsy (2002)

- 2" Diameter Lemon Yellow Blooms on Willowy 17"-20" Tall Scapes that Sway in Every Breeze
- Slender Medium Green 12"-20" Tall Semi-Evergreen Foliage
- Earliest Blooming Variety; Blooms 85-275 Days Per Year
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11; Tolerates Extreme Heat and Cold
- Good Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Buttered Popcorn (2006)

- Profuse 6" Diameter Bright Gold Blooms on Sturdy 28"-33" Tall Scapes
- Very Lush, Dense 22"-26" Tall Semi-Evergreen Foliage
- Blooms 60-195 Days Per Year
- Beautiful as an Individual Plant, Tough Enough for Roadside and Erosion Plantings
- Appropriately Referred to as "The Big Stella de Oro" or "Stella on Steroids"
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Good Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Frankly Scarlet (2003)

- 4" Diameter Sunburst Scarlet Red Blooms on Slender 18"-30" Tall Stalks
- 14"-27" Tall Dense, Dark Green Deciduous Foliage
- Blooms 50-185 Days Per Year
- Heat and Drought Tolerant; Good for Erosion Control; Salt Tolerant
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Excellent Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Lullaby Baby (1998)

- Sculpted 4" Diameter Cream Pink Blooms on Well Branched 18"-24" Tall Scapes
- Elegant Dark Green 15"-20" Tall Deciduous Foliage
- Blooms 50-110 Days Per Year
- Nice Border Plant, Cold Hardy
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11; Partial Shade in Zones 9-11
- Excellent Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Exhibition Category



Red Volunteer (2005)

- Large 6"-7" Diameter Crimson Red Blooms on Well Branched 29"-33" Tall Stalks (Scapes)
- Lush, Wide 20"-26" Tall Dark Green Deciduous Foliage
- Blooms 25-70 Days Per Year, Depending on Climate
- Good for Mid to Back Border in Full Sun or Partial Shade
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-10
- Good Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Exhibition Category



Plum Perfect (2003)

- 3"-4" Diameter Plum Purple Blooms with Darker Eyes on Well Branched 16"-28" Tall Stalks
- Dense 14"-24" Tall Medium Green Evergreen Foliage
- Blooms 25-175 Days Per Year
- Thrives in Light Shade
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Excellent Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Starstruck (1993)

- Large, Ruffled 6"-7" Diameter Gold Blooms on Well Branched 24"-30" Scapes
- Medium Green, Lush 15"-20" Tall Deciduous Foliage
- Blooms 30-140 Days Per Year
- Late Season Bloomer, Combine with Early Bloomers for Extended Display
- Use: Great Focal Plant; High Bud Count Provides Bold Color Display
- Recommended for USDA Zones 5-10; Partial Shade in Zones 9-10
- Scorch/rot Susceptible to Rust
- Winner in the Exhibition Category



Miss Mary Mary (2005)

- Petite 2 1/2" Diameter Yellow-Gold Blooms on Slender 12"-17" Tall Stalks
- Tidy 8"-14" Tall Gray Deciduous Foliage Perfect for Borders
- Blooms 60-175 Days Per Year
- First Blooms Single, Double Blooms on Repeat Cycles Until Frost
- Good Hardy and Heat Tolerant
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-10
- Excellent Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Leebea Orange Crush (2002)

- 5"-6" Diameter Clear Orange, Lightly Fragrant Blooms on 20"-26" Scapes
- 14"-20" Tall, Well Groomed, Dense Blue-Green Semi-Evergreen Foliage
- Blooms 45-175 Days Per Year
- Uniform Bloom and Foliage Height is Dramatic in Mass Plantings
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11, Much in Zones 4-5
- Somewhat Susceptible to Rust
- Double Winner: Landscape and Exhibition Categories



Black-Eyed Stella (1994)

- 2 1/2"-3 1/2" Diameter Light Gold Blooms with Red Eyeline on Slender 12"-22" Tall Scapes
- Dense, Fine Textured Dark Green, 10"-18" Tall Evergreen Foliage
- Blooms 100-257 Days Per Year
- Superior Performer Across Nine USDA Zones
- Recommended for USDA Zones 2-10
- Superior Alternative to Stella de Oro on the Pacific and Gulf Coasts
- Good Rust Resistance, Heat Tolerance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Lady Lucille (2004)

- Large 5"-6" Diameter Brilliant Red-Orange Blooms on 22"-30" Tall Scapes
- Shiny Dark Green 15"-20" Tall Deciduous Foliage is Very Heat Tolerant
- Blooms 28-90 Days Per Year
- Unsurpassed Carrying Power (Viability) in Mass Plantings
- Blooms Late; Plant with Earlier Varieties to Extend the Season
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Excellent Rust Resistance
- Winner in the Landscape Category



Judith (2002)

- 5" Diameter Pink Blooms with Darker Pink Eyezone on 20"-28" Tall Scapes
- Vigorous 16"-20" Tall Deciduous Foliage
- Blooms 45-150 Days Per Year
- Up to 50 Blooms Per Well Branched Scap
- Good Rust Resistance
- Recommended for USDA Zones 4-11
- Winner in the Exhibition Category
